**REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE STATISTICS ACT, 1976:
COLLECTION OF STATISTICS REGARDING CHILD
ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES**

The President has under section 17 of the Statistics Act, 1976 (Act No. 66 of 1976), made the regulations set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, an expression defined in the Statistics Act, 1976 (Act No. 66 of 1976) has a corresponding meaning and -

"head of a household" means the person responsible for the management of the affairs of a household;

"household" means all persons living in the same dwelling unit and any person temporarily absent (for example on holiday, in hospital, at boarding school or university) from that dwelling unit.

Furnishing of statistics

2. (1) Every head of a household shall furnish orally to the Secretary the following statistics -

- (a) in relation to each member of the household -
 - (i) name;
 - (ii) relationship to the head of the household;
 - (iii) sex;
 - (iv) age;
 - (v) nationality;
 - (vi) place of birth;
 - (vii) place of usual residence;
 - (viii) marital status;
 - (ix) language spoken;
 - (x) school attendance; and
 - (xi) educational attainment;
- (b) household income and housing conditions of household;
- (c) usual and current economic activities of every child in the household; and

- (d) in respect of every child in that household, who is employed, the -
- (i) occupation or capacity in which the child is employed;
 - (ii) industry or sector in which the child is employed;
 - (iii) status of the child in employment;
 - (iv) age when the child started to work for the first time;
 - (v) number of hours the child worked in a week;
 - (vi) number of hours the child worked overtime in a week;
 - (vii) amount of remuneration paid and the period for which that remuneration is paid to the child;
 - (viii) remuneration paid to the child for overtime work;
 - (ix) savings made from the remuneration paid to the child; and
 - (x) health, safety and welfare of the child at work.

(2) The statistics referred to in subregulation (1) shall be furnished in respect of the period 1 March 1999 to 30 April 1999.

Offences and penalties

3. Any person who, without reasonable cause, contravenes or fails to comply with these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding N\$ 200 or, in the case of a continuing failure to comply with the regulations, to a fine not exceeding N\$ 10 for every day during which the failure continues.
